



Training Course on Conceptual Models for Water Resource Management Using Isotope Hydrology and Hydrochemistry: Part 1

Introduction

The course is open to 15 to 20 participants. In the selection of nominated participants priority will be given to technical and scientific staff involved in planning and implementing hydro(geo)logical research and/or projects related to water resources assessment and management involving the use of isotope hydrology tools and approaches.

Objectives

The purpose of this course is to provide a comprehensive review of the principles and methodologies for developing and testing conceptual hydrological models using isotope hydrology data, as well as applying these models to address critical water resource management challenges, with a focus on real-world case studies. The training course will include a blend of lectures, group discussions, and case study analyses covering key theoretical and applied topics in hydrogeology, including groundwater flow systems, recharge processes, isotope selection and application, and the interpretation of isotopic and geochemical data. Emphasis will be placed on integrating supporting data such as climate, topography, geology, land use, and surface water–groundwater interactions, as well as on the role of GIS and remote sensing in hydrological conceptualization. Delivered in an online format, the course prioritizes interactive engagement and practical exercises. Participants will be supported in formulating key water resource questions—such as source identification, recharge estimation, contamination sources, and flow path delineation—and in designing appropriate isotope sampling strategies to address these issues. The conceptual model is central to the design, execution, and interpretation of isotope hydrology studies and serves as a critical tool for informed water resources management and policy development. Strengthening skills in conceptual modelling supports more effective decision-making and maximizes the impact of national and regional technical cooperation projects.

Target Audience

Participants should have a university degree with a technical/scientific profile that attests to their experience with the use of hydrological, hydrogeological or hydrochemical techniques, and/or their involvement in water resources assessment and/or management. They should preferably have a good understanding of water-related/hydrogeological issues. As the course will be conducted in English, participants should have sufficient proficiency to follow lectures and express themselves in this language without difficulty. In the case of countries in which English is not an official or customary language, nominations must be accompanied by a separate certificate attesting to the candidate's proficiency in English. This certificate must be issued by a language school or cultural institution, or by the embassy of a country in which English is spoken.

Participation and Registration

All persons wishing to participate in the event have to be designated by an IAEA Member State or should be members of organizations that have been invited to attend.

 - Submit their application.

Once submitted through the InTouch+ platform, the application, together with the auto-generated form(s), will be transmitted automatically to the required authority for approval. If approved, the application, together with the applicable form(s), will automatically be sent to the IAEA through the online platform.
