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The Secretariat of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) presents its compliments to the IAEA's Member States and has the honour to draw their attention to the IAEA Marie Skłodowska-Curie Fellowship Programme (MSCFP).

As Member States are aware, the IAEA MSCFP helps to encourage young women to pursue careers in the nuclear field. Over the 6 years since its launch in 2020, the MSCFP has already supported 860 female students representing 135 Member States studying in 79 countries around the globe. As of August 2026, 561 fellows have completed their master's programme with support from the IAEA MSCFP. Most fellows have subsequently either pursued an internship facilitated by the IAEA or employment or PhD studies in their field.

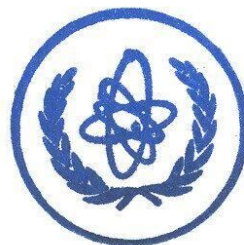
The IAEA MSCFP is an ongoing initiative with the aim of ensuring that more women have an opportunity to pursue advanced education in the nuclear related field. Accordingly, the Secretariat has the honour to inform Member States that the application period for the IAEA MSCFP 2026 cycle opened on 1 September and will close on 31 October 2026. Female students in nuclear related fields may apply for scholarships for academic years 2026/2027 and 2027/2028.

Selected applicants will receive a scholarship for a master's programmes in nuclear related studies from accredited universities. Additionally, a limited number of internship placements will be provided through a competitive process. Consideration is given to geographic distribution, the field of study distribution, linguistic diversity and whether the applicant has received previous support from the IAEA.

Member States are invited to facilitate the dissemination of this information by transmitting it to the relevant national authorities for further circulation among potential donors, partners, universities and students.
